



The 1974 UNESCO Recommendation concerning education for international understanding, co-operation and peace and education relating to human rights and fundamental freedoms -under revision -

Adopted on 19 November 1974, UNESCO's Recommendation concerning Education for International Understanding, Co-operation and Peace and Education relating to Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms formulates principles and norms in support of education that has a foundational role in the transformation of our societies. Education connects us with the world and to each other, and strengthens our capacities for dialogue and action.

Students and teachers from ASPnet in France, Germany, Poland, Republic of Moldova, and Romania, with the participation of students and teachers forcibly displaced from Ukraine in Republic of Moldova, Poland and Romania, due to the criminal war having innocent people as collateral victims, met online for discussing what can make the difference for them and be proposed in the new Recommendation based on their initiatives to act together in support of peaceful, just, and sustainable futures.

Common actions identification and key messages formulation considered the following thematic areas relevant to the 1974 Recommendation:

- Education for sustainable development facilitated by the German National Commission for UNESCO representatives
- Education for heritage facilitated by the Polish National Commission for UNESCO representatives
- Education through arts. Theater as case study facilitated by the National Commission of Romania for UNESCO representatives
- Education for global citizenship facilitated by a representative of the National Commission of Ukraine or the Republic of Moldova for UNESCO representatives
- Education for human rights and fundamental freedom facilitated by the National Commission of France for UNESCO representatives

At the meetings and after, from October 2022 till March 2023, based on the methodological support and coordination by Mihai I. Grăjdeanu, Romanian comics teacher and author, the students "translated" the agreed conclusions of the thematic workshops, formulated as verbal messages, into comics'-based messages.

This is the digital catalogue of the messages conveyed through comics.

The Steps for creating a short comic

Subject: The 1974 UNESCO Recommendation concerning education for international understanding, co-operation and peace and education relating to human rights and fundamental freedoms.

Step 1

A comic page could be created by a **team of students.**They could write and draw the story. First we will draw with a pencil, then the drawings are outlined with a black pen and at the end we add color.



Step 2 Instruments for one comic page creation. One sheet of normal paper A4 (format), drawing pencil, eraser, ruler and a black fine liner with thin tip for outlines.

Step 3 - The story

The coordinator discussed with the students how to create a short story with a message. They could write simple dialogs for characters and the narrator's text. The story was based on the thematic workshops.


Step 4 - Drawings

The coordinator showed the students how easy is to draw using simple shapes or the stick man as a character.
